

WEEK'S ACTIVITIES AT THE PLAYGROUNDS

**Motion Pictures New Feature at
Parks on Aug. 14 and 15;
Games; Classes**

A new feature is being presented next week at two of the park district playgrounds. On Thursday evening, August 14, before the dance at Sunset Park, there will be a presentation of motion pictures of events and activities of people and organizations around Highland Park. These scenes have been taken by Mr. Hunter. There are scenes of park board activities, such as golf tournaments, water carnivals, winter scenes, playground groups, ball games, and many other things that everyone has participated in. The pictures will be shown for the first time, and many of them are of recent events.

On Friday evening, August 15, the same pictures will be shown at the Ravinia school playground. One of the features of these showings will be that they are to be shown out of doors.

Mrs. Emma Tillman Dies Aug. 1; Funeral Held Here on Sunday

Mrs. Emma Meyer Tillman, widow of the late William Tillman, died on August 1, at her home in Chicago. The funeral service was held at three o'clock Sunday afternoon at the First United Evangelical church, Highland Park, the Rev. C. G. Unangst officiating, assisted by the Rev. Elmer Gieser. Burial was in the Northfield cemetery. The following obituary notice is contributed:

Emma Meyer Tillman was born on August 20, 1862, in Barrington, Ill. Her youth was spent here and she grew up with a family of brothers and sisters of whom four sisters and one brother survive. She spent several years in Lomira, Wis., and later lived in Elgin and Highland Park.

She was married to the late William Tillman on October 25, 1906, and his two sons, Arthur and Milton came under her care. Mr. and Mrs. Tillman lived happily together until his death October 25, 1926, the twentieth anniversary of their marriage. Mrs. Tillman continued to live in Highland Park until the fall of 1929 when she and her eldest sister and niece moved to Chicago. On August 1st she slipped quietly away to her heavenly home. Her passing occurred on the birthday anniversary of her husband.

In her youth Mrs. Tillman united with the United Evangelical church of which she remained a faithful member. She greatly enjoyed her association with members of the W. F. M. S. of the church and the local W.C.T.U. Mrs. Tillman was a woman of deep religious convictions. Those nearest to her know that she yearned for "that city not made with hands, whose builder and maker is God" — for her "life's fitful fever is o'er," for "He hath given his beloved sleep."

New Electric Rate Is Being Well Received, Pub. Service Co. Report

The new rate plan of the Public Service Company of Northern Illinois which is heralded by the company as a \$1,000,000 saving to the public annually, went into effect, Aug. 1.

The change, according to John G. Learned, vice-president, is from the maximum demand system to the room basis, the charge being based on the number of rooms in the home, the number of sockets in the home, the number of sockets not being considered. The first four kilowatt hours per room will cost 8 cents each, the second four kilowatt hours or less per room, 7 cents each, the third four kilowatt hours per room, 5 cents each; and each kilowatt hour per room in excess of 12 will be 3 cents per kilowatt hour. Because of ordinance provisions the 8 cent rate will not apply in Arlington Heights, Kenilworth, Lake Bluff, and Melrose Park.

A new rate for small commercial users was also announced as effective August 1. It will amount to a reduction for stores, shops and offices. Any customer who wished to be billed under the old system will be accommodated, the company announces.
