

### Julian N. Stupey Dies in Waukegan; Born Here 80 Years Ago; Funeral

Julian N. Stupey, a resident of Waukegan for the last 30 years, and a pioneer resident of Lake county, passed away at his home, 532 Grand avenue, Sunday night at 8:45 o'clock at the age of 80 years. Death followed an illness of but a few days. Mr. Stupey bore the distinction of being the oldest living native resident of Lake county. He was born at Port Clinton, now known as Highland Park on December 16, 1849. His father's farm constituted what is now the Exmoor Country club.

Mr. Stupey moved to Horton, Mich., in 1879 where he opened a harness

shop. In 1880 he married Miss Nellie H. Yorks, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. C. Yorks. In 1889 they moved to Highland Park, where they resided until December, 1893, when they moved to Waukegan and have resided there ever since.

Besides his widow, he leaves two sons: Wayne T. Stupey, managing editor of the Waukegan Daily Times, and Maurice B. Stupey, foreman at the Waukegan postoffice. He also leaves a brother, John Stupey of Highwood. The deceased was next to the last survivor of a family of eleven children.

The funeral service was held at two o'clock Wednesday, in Waukegan, and burial was in Oakwood cemetery in that city.
