

**Lake Michigan Breeze  
During Heated Period**

Lake Michigan, which serves as a huge "electric fan" for Chicago during the hot summer months and is one of the principal reasons for the city's prominence as a vacation resort, proved its cooling ability during a recent torrid spell which swept the Middle West, the Chicago Association of Commerce points out. With lake breezes sweeping over the city, Chicago registered a temperature of 84 degrees at the same time other Illinois cities, less than 50 miles inland, were sweltering under temperatures as high as 95 degrees. At the same time, temperatures in several Nebraska, Iowa and southern Illinois cities rose as high as 108 degrees.

**Outline Program of  
State Fair Aug. 16-23  
Many Notable Features**

The departure from established custom in the day-by-day program of the Illinois State fair, August 16 to 23, is bidding successfully for popular approval. This is evident to fair officials from the intense interest in the new features to be inaugurated this season, manifest throughout the state.

In lieu of automobile races on the opening and closing Saturdays—"All Veterans' Day," August 16, and "Derby Day," August 23—will give the state fair patrons two entirely new forms of entertainment.

Chicago posts are negotiating for excursion trains and special rates to Springfield and return, in order that the veterans, their families and friends, may take this opportunity to assemble at the state capital.

The enjoyable band concert that annually attracts many visitors to the fairgrounds on the Sunday of the fair, will be augmented this season. In addition to the afternoon of harmony, Sunday evening, for the first time, will find the stands well filled with music lovers.

Monday, as "Children's Day," follows precedent, as does Tuesday, "Springfield Day."

Wednesday, designated as "Chicago Day," is also, unofficially, the day for a roundup of Illinois democracy. The Democratic state convention is scheduled for that day.

Thursday, "Governor's Day," and proverbially the big day of the fair, will bring vast throngs of citizens to the state capital for the colorful oration to the chief executive, and for the pre-campaign assembly of Republican party leaders.

Friday, "Farm Bureau Day," will emphasize the close relationship between the state administration and the agricultural population of Illinois.

The closing Saturday, August 23, will present the first great opportunity for state fair patrons to enjoy a real program of running races, with the Governor's Derby as the feature attraction.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN TO ALL PERSONS INTERESTED, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Deerfield having ordered that the local improvement, to-wit: Grading, paving, curbing, draining and otherwise improving the roadway of Orchard Street (Broadmoor Place) between the south street line of Greenwood Avenue and the north street line of Hazel Avenue; Somerset Avenue between the east street line of Meadow Street and the west line of Prairie Street; and Hazel Avenue between a line parallel with and 303.2 feet west of the west street line of Orchard Street (Broadmoor Place) and the west street line of Prairie Street; in the Village of Deerfield, Lake County, Illinois; the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the Village Clerk of said Village and in the County Court of Lake County, Illinois, for an assessment of the cost of said improvement according to the benefits; and an assessment therefor having been made and returned to said Court (Docket No. 86) the final hearing thereon will be held on the 18th day of August, A. D. 1930, at ten o'clock A.M. or as soon thereafter as the business of the Court will permit.

Said ordinance provides that the aggregate amount of said assessment shall be divided into ten (10) installments bearing interest at the rate of six (6%) per cent per annum from the date of the first voucher issued on account of work done on said improvement. All persons desiring may file objections in said court before said day and may appear on the hearing and make their defense.
