The final score was 8-7. The game looked as if it were closed up and finished in the sixth. Sunset was leading 7-3, due to a homer hit by Bob McClure with three on. In the Ravinia seventh Happy Wampler galloped across the plate with one more run and Ravinia rested in the eighth. Then came that tragic ninth. Ravinia holds the edge on the series now with a margin of two games, having won five and lost three. There are three games left in the series.

Break Tie

The tie in the series between Sunset and Ravinia was broken last Wednesday when Ravinia took a slugging victory from the Highland Park boys by a 12-8 score. The game was played at Ravinia. Everything was about even until the seventh, when the Ravinia boys broke loose and cleaned up seven runs. Brennan, the Sunset pitcher, couldn't seem to get his arm working again, while Tepper, the Ravinia hurler, held the Sunset bunch scoreless after the fifth. Former H. P. Woman Dies in Leap Before Train; Inquest Shows

A coroner's jury, meeting in the Kelly Funeral home in this city Monday morning, held that Mrs. Anna M. Goodnow of Glencoe, a former prominent resident of Waukegan, came to her death by leaping in front of a Chicago & North Western train at Zion early Saturday with suicidal intent.

The aged woman, recently widowed, took her life while suffering from melancholia, the coroner's jury decided. Dr. J. L. Taylor of Libertyville, county coroner, conducted the inquest.

Funeral services were held at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon at the Kelly home, with interment in the Elmwood cemetery at River Grove.

Dies at Hospital

Mrs. Goodnow, who died in the Victory Memorial hospital in Waukegan, Saturday morning, several hours after being struck by the train, was the widow of George Goodnow, formerly head of the North Shore Gas company, and they formerly lived on N. Sheridan road, Waukegan and removed from there recently. Mrs. Goodnow moved to 373 Hazel avenue Glencoe, after selling her property in Highland Park. She was building a new home here.

Two sons, A. C. Goodnow, 679 Valley road, Glencoe, and George Goodnow of Toledo, are the immediate survivors.

Mrs. Goodnow went to Zion on a North Shore train early Saturday morning, walking across the city to the North Western station, where she jumped in front of an oncoming freight train, according to the Waukegan Times. The son, Albert, said she had just returned from Europe, where she had visited for some time, and seemed to be in good health, although she had brooded over her husband's death.

The family was well known in Highland Park and had many warm friends here, whose sympathy is extended the relatives in their sad bereavement.
