

## SECOND DEATH IN PRZYBORSKI CRASH

### Murray MacLeod, Chicago Banker Dies of Injuries Saturday; Inquest

Death of the second victim of the tragic automobile accident south of Des Plaines last Wednesday that claimed the life of Mrs. Marie Przyborski, of North Chicago, and injured several other Waukegan and North Chicago persons, occurred late Saturday night when Murray MacLeod, 41 years old, a prominent banker, succumbed in the Ravenswood hospital, Chicago.

#### In Other Car

Mr. MacLeod, who resided at 235 Warwick road, suffered a fractured leg and internal injuries in the crash of his machine with that driven by Max Przyborski, Lake county republican committee chairman and a prominent North Chicago attorney.

The decedent was a well known Chicago banker, being president of the Irving Park National, Albany Park National, and Portage Park National banks.

#### Others Recovering

Albert J. Schorsch, 43, 5910 Newport avenue, Chicago, was riding with MacLeod, and he was at first believed more seriously hurt than MacLeod, but Schorsch is reported as improving.

Others in the accident are all improving, a check-up this week showed. Mr. Przyborski is at his home in North Chicago, and Mrs. Blanche

Hansen, wife of Attorney Harold J. Hansen, and Mrs. Irma Tallett, wife of Justice Harold J. Tallett, are both in good condition at the Victory Memorial hospital.

#### Inquest August 28

The inquest into the death of Mrs. Przyborski is to be held August 28 in Des Plaines, and the coroner's jury that heard several witnesses last Thursday, will be asked to delve into causes of the death of the Kenilworth banker.

The investigation was continued pending the recovery of those involved in the crash, and Przyborski, driver of the car, was held on a technical charge, being released under bonds of \$5,000.

MacLeod's widow and two children survive.

Funeral services were held Tuesday morning from his Kenilworth home, with burial at Rosehill cemetery.

### Elimination Contest at Deerpath Theatre

The amounts paid into the teacher's pension fund during the last year reached \$6,383 or \$632 more than a year ago, according to an announcement made today by T. A. Simpson, county superintendent of schools, who files the report with the state.

There are about ten teachers in Lake county receiving pensions at this time, according to the superintendent.

The law provides, he pointed out, that for the first ten years a teacher gives \$5 annually to the fund. Between ten and fifteen years of service the amount is raised to \$10 annually. From 15 to 25 years the pension fund claims \$30 a year. During this period of time a teacher contributes a total of \$400.

After 25 years of teaching, providing the instructor is 50 years of age, the pension can be claimed if desired and \$400 is paid annually.
