SECOND DEATH IN PRZYBORSKI CRASH

Murray MacLeod, Chicago Banker Dies of Injuries Saturday; Inquest

Death of the second victim of the tragic automobile accident south of Des Plaines last Wednesday that claimed the life of Mrs. Marie Przyborski, of North Chicago, and injured several other Waukegan and North Chicago persons, occurred late Saturday night when Murray MacLeod, 41 years old, a prominent banker, succumbed in the Ravenswood hospital, Chicago.

Przyborski is to be held August 28 in Des Plaines, and the coroner's jury that heard several witnesses last Thursday, will be asked to delve into causes of the death of the Kenilworth banker.

The investigation was continued pending the recovery of those involved in the crash, and Przyborski, driver of the car, was held on a technical charge, being released under bonds of \$5,000.


