His subject will be: "The Challenge of the Master." We invite Mr. Taylor's many Highland Park friends to come and hear him.

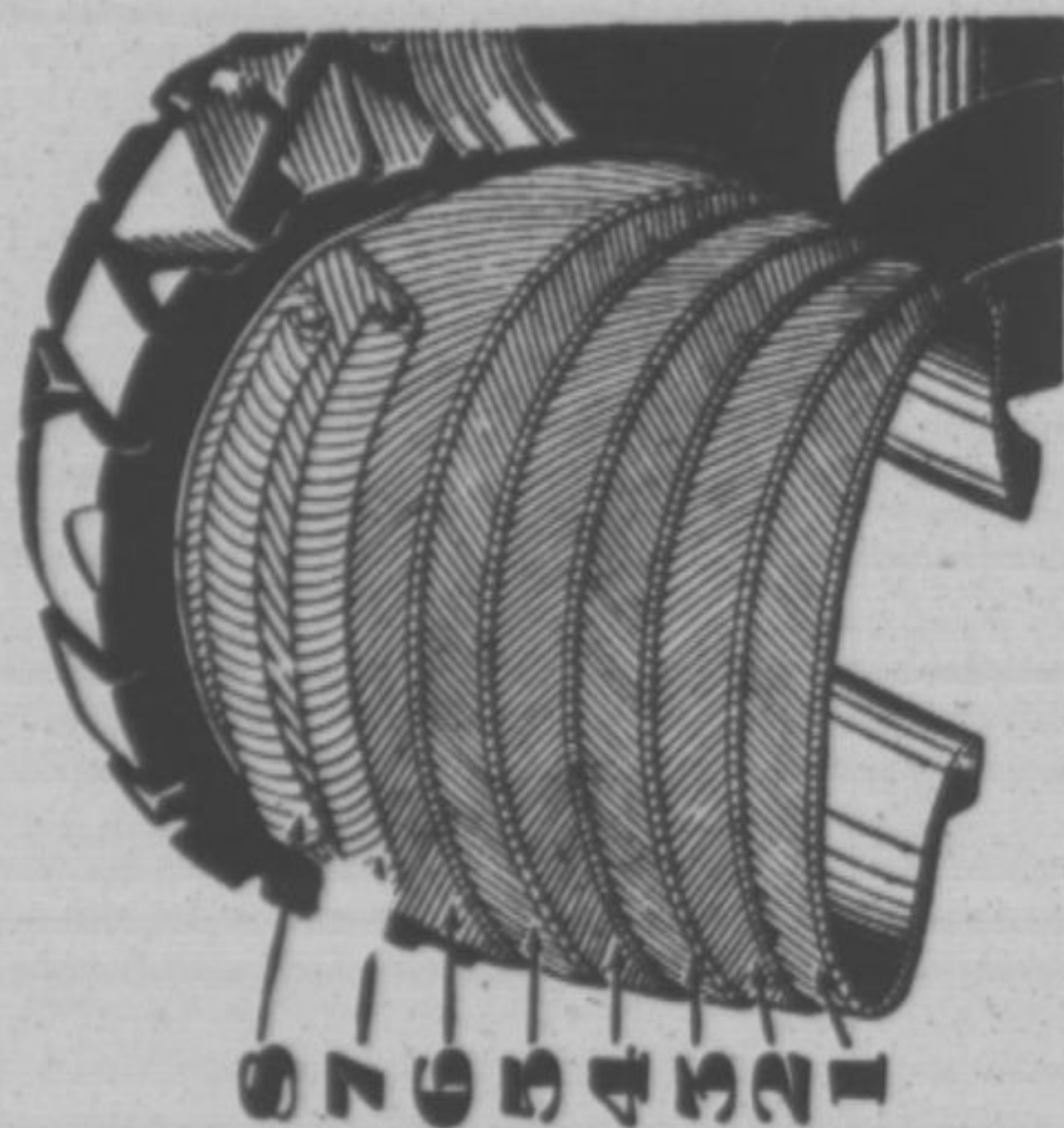
