Takes Action to Push Electrification Plan for Chicago Railroads

Action to force the thirty-one railroads of Chicago to electrify their lines within a fifty-mile radius of Chicago and to supplant old stations with new ones, was taken before the Illinois commerce commission.

The Chicago and Northwestern was one of the railroads included in the petition. If the Northwestern electrifies, it is expected that Waukegan will be the terminal of the steam and electrically controlled divisions of the road.

The petition was filed with the commission in behalf of the Tribune Company. It asks that the defendants be made to disclose their present plans for reconstruction and electrification and that they file an answer within the next thirty days.

NOTICE OF AWARDED CONTRACT

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested that bids for the furnishing of all labor, tools, and materials necessary for the construction of a reinforced concrete pavement with combined curb and gutter and other necessary improvements in Taylor Avenue, in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, were opened on the 4th day of August, A. D. 1930, and the Highways Construction Company, being the lowest responsible bidder, the contract was awarded to the said Highways Construction Company, on the 11th day of August, A. D. 1930.

Said bid for the work is as follows:

No. 1.
1000 cubic yards of excavation, measured in the cut, for the roadway and parkways, including preparing the subgrade to receive the concrete pavement and combined curb and gutter, and removal of all surplus excavated materials, complete at No Dollars Ninety-five Cents (\$0.95) per cubic yard \$950.00

No. 2.
2350 square yards of reinforced concrete pavement eight (8) inches thick overall, and sixteen (16) feet in width. The concrete composed by volume of one (1) part Portland cement, two (2) parts sand, and three and one-half (3 1/2) parts gravel or crushed stone, mixed with sufficient water, reinforced with electric welded steel wire fabric having both longitudinal and transverse members, made of gauge No. 2 wire, spaced six (6) inches apart, with one-half (1/2) inch transverse expansion joints, spaced thirty (30) feet apart, and V-shaped longitudinal center joints, all with steel bars, including curing by using one (1) gallon of asphaltic emulsion for each twenty-five (25) square yards of pavement (the Hunt process or its equal), and including all protecting and cleaning constructed complete at Two Dollars Eighty Cents (\$2.80) per square yard 6580.00

No. 3.
2550 lineal feet of concrete combined curb and gutter, the concrete to be composed by volume of one (1) part Portland cement, two (2) parts sand, and three and one-half (3 1/2) parts gravel or crushed stone, except that the exposed surface, to a depth of one-half (1/2) inch shall be of mortar composed by volume of one (1) part Portland cement and two (2) parts sand, both mortar and concrete mixed with sufficient water. The overall width at the bottom eighteen (18) inches, the overall height fourteen (14) inches, and the thickness of the gutterflap eight (8) inches, including curing as described for the pavement, protecting, and cleaning, constructed complete at No Dollars Ninety-five Cents (\$0.95) per lineal foot 2422.50

No. 4.
5000 square yards of parkways smoothed and hand-raked, complete at No Dollars Eight Cents (\$0.08) per square yard 400.00

No. 5.
10 existing inlet basins cleaned, and covers adjusted to new grade, complete at Fifteen Dollars No Cents (\$15.00) each 150.00

No. 6.
8 existing manholes and valve vaults cleaned, and covers adjusted to new grade, complete at Fifteen Dollars No Cents (\$15.00) each 120.00

No. 7.
2 existing fire hydrants adjusted to grade in such a manner that the hose connections will be at

least eighteen (18) inches above the top of the curb, where located, including all necessary appurtenances, excavating, back-filling, testing, and removal of all surplus excavated material, complete at Eighty Dollars No Cents (\$80.00) each 160.00

No. 8.
30 cubic yards of crushed limestone to be furnished and placed, in Beverly Place, to provide an approach to the concrete pavement, including rolling of said stones, all necessary excavating, and removal of all surplus excavated material, complete at Four Dollars Fifty Cents (\$4.50) per cubic yard 135.00

No. 9.
2 core tests, including laboratory test and repairing the pavement, complete at Fifteen Dollars No Cents (\$15.00) each 30.00

TOTAL AMOUNT OF BID \$10,947.50

The owners of a majority of the frontage of the lots and land upon said streets, wherein said work is to be done, may, within ten days of the date hereof, elect to take said work and enter into a written contract, to do said work at ten per centum less than the price at which the same has been awarded.
