## Sensibly Discussed by Cincinnati Enquirer

A great-nephew of Commodore Decatur, just deceased, has devised to the United States Naval academy a sword that was presented by the city of Philadelphia to the famous American naval officer.

The brave, romantic and genius-endowed Decatur remains one of the most attractively striking characters in the history of the nation. His sword very literally carved a new avenue for the onward march of Christian civilization, giving to the United States a sea prestige which struck terror to its foes and stirred the envy and anxious thought of England and other sea powers.

Decatur's famed toast: "My country, may she always be right; but, right or wrong, my country!" has stirred the soul of patriotism through all the years since his day. It has been criticized by moral controversalists, but its essence too deeply is implanted in the American heart ever to be dimmed to lesser luster, for it was born of a very passion of patriotic devotion - as though one had said: "My family, may it always be right; but, right or wrong, my fam-


