

Toledo Marine Unit Wins at Great Lakes

The 311 Company, Toledo, Ohio, unit of the United States Marine corps, carried off all military and rifle competition honors at the annual two-week encampment which ended recently at Great Lakes Naval Training Station.

The Toledo company, under command of Capt. Iven C. Stickney and Lieutenant Carl E. Stahley, was awarded a silver mounted Krag rifle for the highest score in company rifle competition and in addition was awarded the efficiency guidon for all around military efficiency in close competition with other companies from Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan and Minnesota. The Toledo company also made the highest individual score in both the enlisted personnel and officers. For the first time in the history of the Marine corps reserve, a 100 per cent company was brought to camp, it being the Toledo company which brought every man to the encampment.

To Fight Sending of Veteran to Asylum

Enraged because J. N. Woods, 69, of Highwood, was sent to the state insane asylum at Elgin last week, Attorney E. V. Orvis, who is active in the Spanish War veterans and Veterans of Foreign Wars, started a fight for the release of the man, says a Waukegan paper.

The attorney stated that there was no right under the law to send a vet-

eran to an asylum as the law provided that the government must care for these patients except in cases where agreements were made with veterans' societies to send these cases to state institutions.

Mr. Orvis discovered that the aged man spent 13 months in the army and that his present condition is due to a fall that he received in the service. It was shown, also, that Woods suffered from malaria during the war with Spain.

Woods was arrested July 26 when he set fire to his home while in a rage.
