

Three Illinois Vets Listed As Missing

Three Illinois veterans of the World war are listed among the 80 in the latest American Legion list, called "Port of Missing Men," says a report from Springfield.

Walter L. Baughan who was born in Rockford, and was last heard of in the navy at Annapolis, Maryland, 1909 or 1910, is first on the list. His mother is anxious to locate him. George W. McClure of the American Legion at Monmouth is asking that any information of Baughan be sent to him.

McClure of Monmouth is also asking for information of Edward H. Kirk, whose mother wants to hear from him. Kirk was born in Manchester, Ohio, and was last heard of

when he was going to Portland, Oregon, to enlist in the army, 1913.

Edgar B. Leet of near Mounds City is the third. He was in Company G. 119th infantry, and was last seen in the fall of 1925 when he left his father's home near Mounds City, Ill. Information of him is sought by Charles D. Leet of Grayville, Ill.

Expect Improvement of Waukegan Harbor Will Be Started in Spring

The proposed improvement and additions to the Waukegan harbor probably will not be started until next spring, according to advices received from Washington. Although this work has been authorized by Congress the money will not be forthcoming until the winter session when

the regular appropriation will be passed. This will permit the starting of construction work and dredging early in the spring, in fact as soon as navigation opens.

The Board of the U. S. Army engineers for rivers and harbors have just submitted their official report. This report contains details of the \$304,000 local harbor project. Under the terms of the rivers and harbors bill, which includes the local improvement the \$304,000 will be spent in building breakwaters and in dredg-

ing both the inner and outer basins.

Only \$274,000 of this amount is immediately available, however, although an additional annual sum of \$7,000 is provided for maintenance of the new improvement, in addition to other sums for harbor developments.

Expenditure of \$8,000 for dredging and enlarging the inner basin is contingent upon erection at the foot of the city park at Madison street at an estimated cost of \$30,000.


