Mr. and Mrs. George Koon and daughters returned Saturday from a two weeks stay in Michigan.

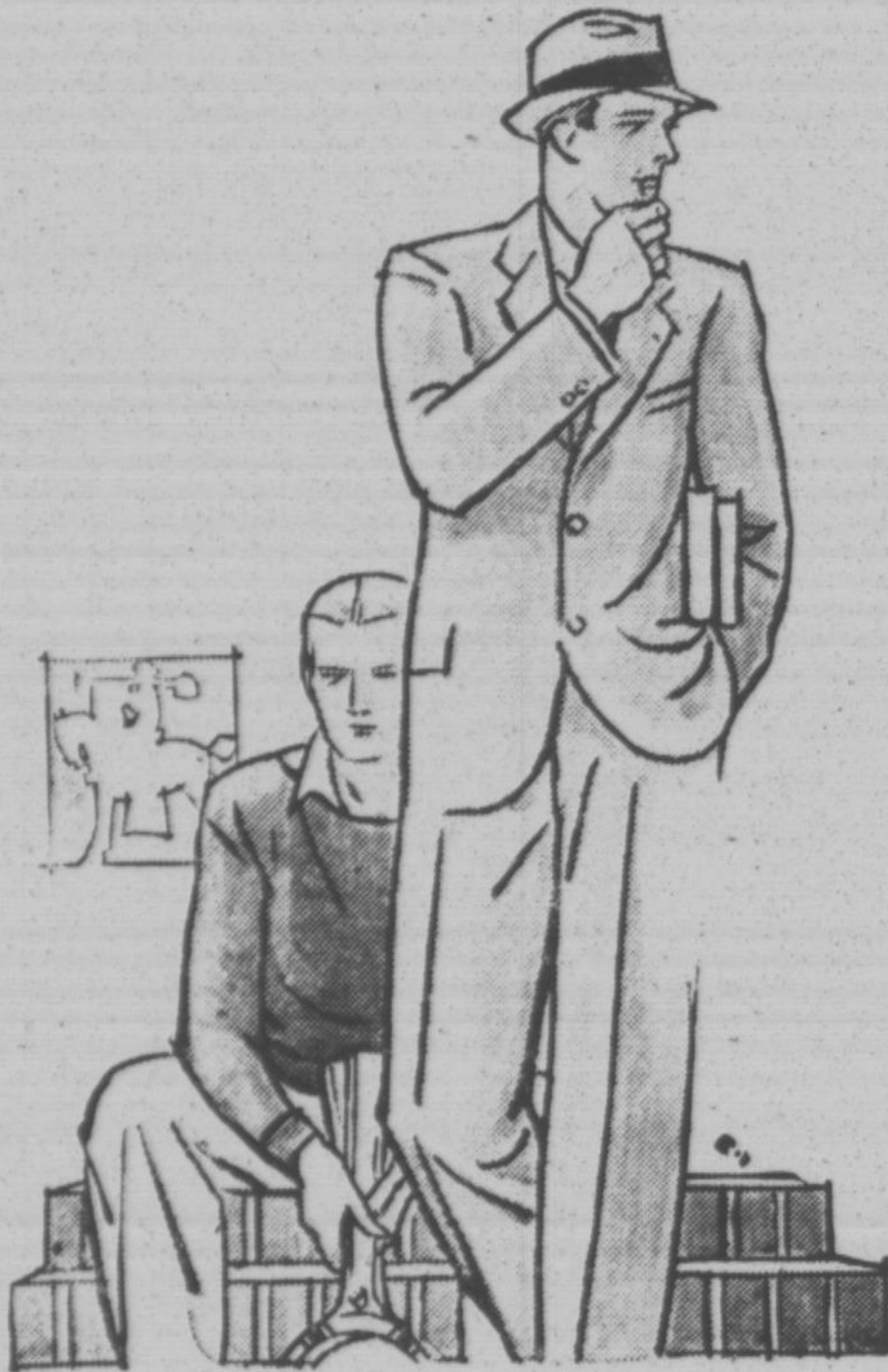
Miss Enid Pearce sailed on the Britannic August 16, to visit relatives in England, Scotland and France. She will return the early part of November.
