Northwestern Given Use of Old P. L. & W.

The Illinois Commerce commission last week authorized the Chicago & North Western railroad to operate over the tracks of the Palatine, Lake Zurich & Wauconda railroad across the Northwest highway, three-fourths of a mile northwest of Palatine.

The North Western proposes to purchase from the defunct railroad's receiver all real estate, rights-of-way, tracks and franchises.

Pending this purchase, it is necessary to operate across the Northwest highway, although the purchase, when completed, will not mean that rehabilitation of the railroad that originally was built by farmers in that district to provide transportation that later was displaced by concrete roads and truck traffic.

The receivership proceedings are pending in the Lake county circuit court. While the parties have agreed on the price, the actual transfer cannot take place until the title of the defunct railroad is cleared.

Man Who Threw Himself Under Car Is Insane

Ivar Coskinen, 29, of 12 N. Butrick street, Waukegan, who threw himself under the wheels of an automobile at Genesee and Washington streets in that city last week in an attempt at suicide was taken to the state asylum at Elgin after being found insane by a commission of physicians in county court.

Coskinen was laboring under the impression that he was losing his mind and intended to take his life rather than go insane, it was learned at the hearing. He had been under treatment for his mental condition.

Coskinen had just left the office of a doctor when he made the attempt on his life. He poised on the curb, witnesses said, and leaped under a machine driven by Richard Mulder, of 32 S. Park avenue, Waukegan. He was removed to the hospital where it was found that his only injuries were two lacerations about the face.

Educational Units of State to Visit County Fairs During Season

Approximately 40 district and county fairs of Illinois will be visited this year by educational exhibits of the state, which present, in an attractive manner, the services and activities of the various departments in the executive branch of the state government.

Five units will tour the state, starting the latter part of this month and continuing until the end of the fair season in late September and early October.

The division of educational exhibits this year will present for the first time exhibits from the Department of Conservation, Division of Forestry; the State Fire Marshal's office, and the Department of Mines and Minerals.

While all of the exhibits show the valuable services being performed by the state for the taxpayers, many of them also teach a lesson—to illustrate; The Division of Forestry's exhibit, presents forceful reasons for the development of a comprehensive system of forestry conservation; the Fire Marshal's display stresses some of the most simple methods of fire prevention, while the exhibits from the Department of Mines and Minerals reveals to the uninitiated the amazing range of Illinois' mineral resources.

Included among the displays, are exhibit picturizing the activities of the various divisions of the department of agriculture which are being carried on quietly to improve the industry; displays showing the methods and the extent of the efforts of the department of public welfare to restore mentally and physically handicapped wards of society, and reform its delinquent and criminal charges.

Tax Sales in Progress Daily Since Last Week

The first parcels of property of Lake county was sold last week by County Treasurer Jay B. Morse for failure to pay general taxes.

Parcels of property will be sold from day to day, according to Mr. Morse, until the entire property list is sold for delinquent general taxes totaling \$125,000. As soon as this property is sold, the sale of property for delinquent special assessments will be started.

Three Great Lakes Are Higher in Level in July

The great lakes, with the exception of Erie and Ontario, were higher during July than during June, according to the United States lake survey, released last week. Lakes Erie and Ontario have recorded a slight fall each July since 1860.

Lake Superior, with a stage of 602.98, was 0.38 of a foot higher than during June. Since 1860 the average rise has been 0.21 of a foot. Lakes Michigan-Huron, with a stage of 581.28, were 0.22 of a foot above June.
