Lincoln School

Owing to the growth of the school especially in the lower grades two new rooms are being opened up. The old office-library room has been converted into a class room where Mrs. Harvey will have charge of a combination third and fourth grade group.

The orchestra room will be used as a fourth grade class room with Miss Winifred Nelson in charge.

Miss Kathryn Lantz of Rushville, Illinois, a graduate of the Western Illinois State Teachers college and University of Illinois will be added to the staff as a first grade teacher.

Mrs. Bastin will continue as primary teacher and will have charge of a combination first and second grade group.
