AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF TAXES FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, FOR THE YEAR 1930.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE
COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: That the Annual Appropriation bill making appropriations for corporate purposes for the City of Highland Park for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 1930 and ending April 30, 1931, was filed the 23rd day of June, 1930, duly passed June 30th, 1930, and approved June 30th, 1930; and thereafter published as provided by law, which said ordinance by reference is hereby made a part hereof.

SECTION 2: That the sum of Three Hundred Eleven Thousand Two Hundred Seven and 50/100 Dollars (\$311,207.50) having been heretofore legally appropriated for corporate purposes to be collected from the taxes to be levied for said fiscal year beginning May 1st, 1930 and ending April 30th, 1931, be and the same is hereby levied upon all property subject to taxation within the City of Highland Park, as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County Purposes for the said current year.

That the purposes for which said amount of Three Hundred Eleven Thousand Two Hundred Seven and 50/100 Dollars (\$311,207.50) heretofore appropriated and hereby levied respectively are as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 3: The City Clerk of the City of Highland Park is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this ordinance with the County Clerk of Lake County in the State of Illinois, as required by law.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
