

Numerous Features of Interest at Waukegan Festival Aug. 29-Sept. 1

Much progress has been made towards the success of the sixth annual Waukegan Summer Festival put on by the American Legion Homer Dahringer Post, No. 281, in Waukegan on August 29th, 30th, 31st and Labor Day, September 1, 1930. A full program has been planned which consists of many thrilling and diversified features which never heretofore have been shown in any previous festival.

Hetty Cole, the celebrated singing aerialist performs very spectacular and daring stunts on high tight wire and this performance occurs on Friday night, the formal opening of the festival.

AN ORDINANCE Providing for the Levy of Taxes for the Highland Park East Park District for the Fiscal Year from June 1, 1930 to May 31, 1931.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, County of Lake and State of Illinois:

SECTION 1: That whereas the Annual Appropriation Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Making Appropriations for Corporate Purposes for the Fiscal Year from June 1, 1930 to May 31, 1931," was duly passed on the 8th day of July, 1930 and approved on the 8th day of July 1930 and thereafter, on the 17th day of July, 1930 was duly published as provided by law, which said ordinance by reference is hereby made a part hereof: NOW, THEREFORE,

SECTION 2: The sum of Seventy-Two Thousand (\$72,000.00) Dollars having been heretofore legally appropriated for corporate purposes to be collected from taxes levied for fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, the said sum be and the same is hereby levied upon all property subject to taxation within the Highland Park East Park District as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County purposes for said current year.

SECTION 3: That the purpose for which said amount of Seventy-Two Thousand (\$72,000.00) Dollars was heretofore appropriated and is hereby levied, respectively are as follows: to-wit:
