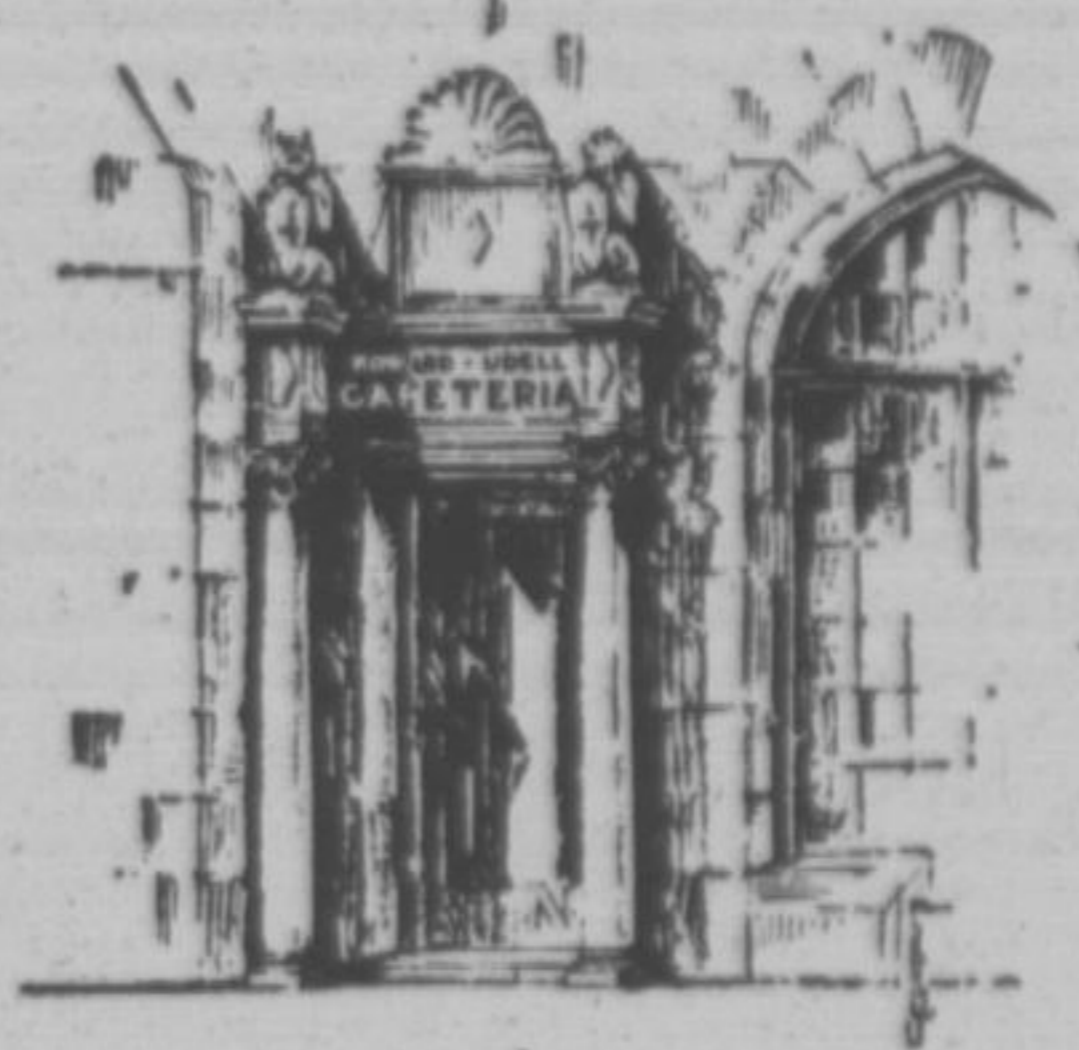
Ned Ball who spent the summer at Charlevoix, Mich., returned to his home last week.
