Joe Hironimous, leader of the bandit gang, which participated in over 50 robberies in Northern Illinois, eight members of which are now serving long terms in the state penitentiary, last week was charged with arson in connection with the destruction by fire of an \$8,500 barn on the Steve Gregg farm at Sullivan's lake last September.
