### Collector Bound Over to Grand Jury; Freed

Frank P. Worack, deputy U. S. internal revenue collector for Lake county, waived examination Friday before Justice Henry Wallenwein in Waukegan on a charge of embezzlement and was bound over to the grand jury. His bond was set at \$5,000.

Worack is alleged to have collected \$2,913.28 from clients while he was manager of the Charles A. Worack insurance agency after it was taken over by David Adams and Harold J. Hansen in 1928. Worack was engaged as manager of the insurance agency

by Adams and Hansen. He continued in that post until December 31, 1929, when Worack received his appointment as an internal revenue collector.

Assistant State's Attorney Hervey Coulson represented the state at the hearing Friday.
