

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, County of Lake and State of Illi-

SECTION 1: That whereas the Annual Appropriation Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Making Appropriations for Corporate Purposes for the Fiscal Year from June 1, 1930 to May 31, 1931," was duly passed on the sth day of July, 1930 and approved on the 8th day of July 1930 and thereafter, on the 17th day of July, 1930 was duly published as provided by law, which said ordinance by reference is hereby made a part hereof: NOW,

SECTION 2: The sum of Seventy-Two Thousand (\$72,000.00) Dollars having been heretofore legally appropriated for corporate purposes to be collected from taxes levied for fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, the said sum be and the same is hereby levied upon all property subject to taxation within the Highland Park East Park District as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County purposes for said current year.


