

### Predicts Increase in Milk Price in County

Increase in the price of milk to jobbers and consumers in Lake county this fall was predicated last week by Charles Ray of Grayslake, secretary of the Pure Milk Association of Lake county. He bases his predictions on conditions brought about by the drought.

Mr. Ray would not hazard a guess on the possible amount of the increase, according to the Waukegan Times.

According to Mr. Ray the production of milk in Lake county during the past summer has equalled that of other years, but due to the drought which eliminated the possibility of green feeding producers have been forced to use dry feeds at a consequent increase in costs of feeding.

He also contends that the farmers have been able through liberal dry feeding to keep their milk high in percentage of butterfat, determined that the drought should not lower the quality of the milk.

However, the feeding of dry feeds to the cows this early will probably make a shortage later in the fall, he said. In this case it would only be natural that the price should go up. But the whole of Lake county will be supplied with milk, with much to ship:

AN ORDINANCE Providing for the Levy of Taxes for the Highland Park East Park District for the Fiscal Year from June 1, 1930 to May 31, 1931.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District, County of Lake and State of Illinois:

SECTION 1: That whereas the Annual Appropriation Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Making Appropriations for Corporate Purposes for the Fiscal Year from June 1, 1930 to May 31, 1931," was duly passed on the 8th day of July, 1930 and approved on the 8th day of July 1930 and thereafter, on the 17th day of July, 1930 was duly published as provided by law, which said ordinance by reference is hereby made a part hereof: NOW, THEREFORE,

SECTION 2: The sum of Seventy-Two Thousand (\$72,000.00) Dollars having been heretofore legally appropriated for corporate purposes to be collected from taxes levied for fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, the said sum be and the same is hereby levied upon all property subject to taxation within the Highland Park East Park District as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County purposes for said current year.

SECTION 3: That the purpose for which said amount of Seventy-Two Thousand (\$72,000.00) Dollars was heretofore appropriated and is hereby levied, respectively are as follows: to-wit:
