The books needed for each grade are: First grade; Fact and Story Primer; second grade, Fact and Story Reader. Book II Number Friends, Playroad to Health, Progressive Word Series (Primary); third grade, Fact and Story Reader, Book III. English for Use, Book I; Strayer-Upton, arithmetic. Lower grades, Progressive Word Series, the Playroad to Health.

Fourth grade. Fact and Story Reader; Book IV, English for use Book I, Strayer Upton arithmetic. Lower grades, Progressive Word Series, Journeys in District Lands, The Land of Health.

Fifth grade: Lewis and Rawland, Reader Book V, English for use Book II, Strayer. Upton arithmetic middle grades, Progressive Word series, (Intermediate and Advanced). Our Beginnings in Europe and America, United States and Canada, Healthy Living, Book I.

Sixth grade: Same as fifth grade, Websters Elementary Dictionary.

Seventh grade: Lewis and Rowland Reader, Book 8, English for use, Book III, Strayer-Upton arithmetic. Higher grades, Progressive Word Studies (Int. and Adv.) The Making of Our Country, Dictionary.

Eighth grade: Lewis and Rowland Reader, Book 8, English for Use, Book III, Strayer-Upton arithmetic, higher grades, Progressive Word series. The Making of Our Country, Brigham and McFarlarn's geography, Book II Websters Elementary Dictionary.

Books may be purchased at the school from 2 until 5 p.m. Saturday, September 6.

All children who are six years old before January 16 may enter at the beginning of the term for first grade work.
