

**Waukegan Youth Gone
Since Last of August**

Police along the north shore last week were asked to aid in the search for Aaron F. Warfel, 17-year-old son of F. W. Warfel of the Karcher hotel, Waukegan, who was last seen in Freeport, Ill., August 31. At that time the youth, who had \$125 in cash

on his person, was supposed to board a bus for Waukegan. He has not been seen since, and his father fears that he may have met with foul play. Aaron, who is 5 feet 10 inches tall, was wearing a double-breasted dark blue suit at the time of his disappearance.

His shock troops are not all they should be in numbers and ability but if the regulars can stand up under the strenuous schedule then the Purple should be regarded as dangerous.

Capt. Hank Bruder's return to playing form again after being out all last season with a broken leg will add a lot of power to the backfield. His kicking will help make up for part of Bergherm's loss. Everybody in the Wildcat camp is trusting that Capt. Hank has fully recovered from his injury and will be able to perform with all his old time ability. Many feel that as Bruder goes so will go the Wildcats.

In addition to Bruder, Hanley has three other seasoned halfbacks in Al Moore, Sid Burnstein, and Bill Griffin. Both Moore and Burnstein came along fast towards the close of last season and much is expected of them this year.

able. They are Bob Hails, Jimmie Jindrich, Roy Leming, and Ken Fossier. Several sophomore candidates show promise but hardly figure to replace the veterans on hand. They are Harry Mundelius, Fred O'Keefe, Jimmie O'Mara, Phil Seghi, and "Agate" Martin.

Lee Hanley heads the quarterback candidates. He is a veteran of two years experience and besides being a capable field general can also pass and carry the ball. Bert Rield, letterman last year, and Will Lewis, also a letterman who was not in school last season, are other quarterback aspirants. The former was used last fall only as a drop kicker.

Among the sophomore quarterback hopefuls are F. A. Leach and "Reb" Russell. Both these youngsters displayed a lot of possibilities in spring practice and are certain to see considerable service. It is possible that Coach Hanley will shift some of these boys to half so as to get full use of their services as ball carriers.

The line positions shape up fairly strong with the exception of the guard and center positions. The loss of Anderson and Erickson is going to hurt matters and unless their successors come along fast these positions may prove the link that will break the chain.

Libertyville H. S. Enrollment Shows Decrease

High school enrollment in Libertyville took a drop this year as compared with last year, only 301 students having been registered at opening time. The enrollment for the session of 1929-30 was 320. School officials said, however, that the present term's enrollment would be swelled with the usual number of late registrations.

The unexpected drop in enrollment is due, they said to the opening this year of the new high school in Grant township in Fox lake.

Since the opening in 1917 of the Libertyville high school, each year had shown a small increase in the number of students until the present year. The new \$130,000 gymnasium addition of the school opened last year was expected to increase the number of students attending the school.

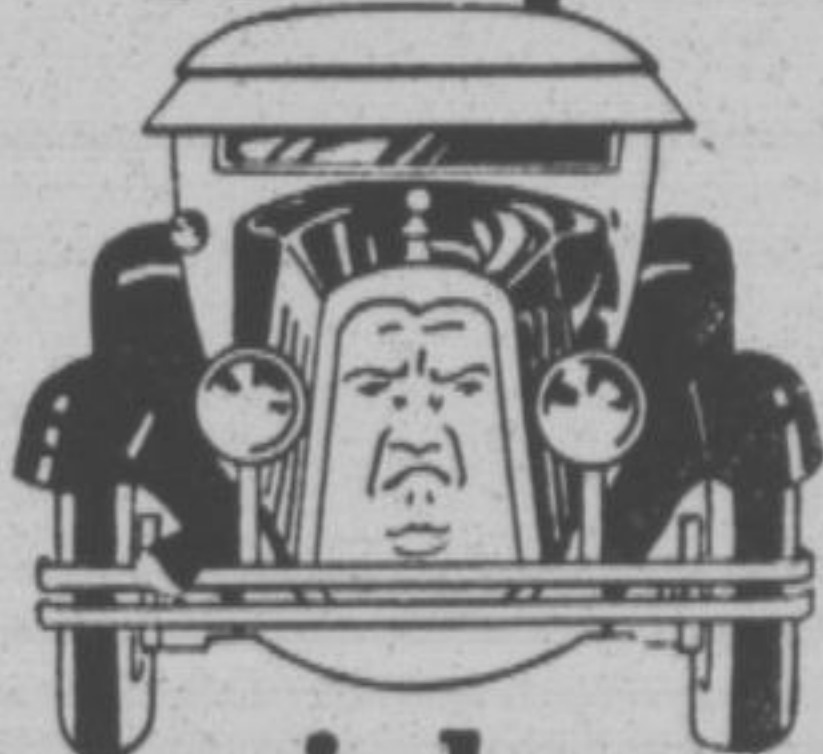
