

Passenger and Truck Auto Licenses Issued in State to End of Aug.

Passenger car licenses issued by Secretary of State William J. Stratton reached the number 1,397,201 by the end of August and truck licenses 200,239. This is an increase of 27,190 over the number of passenger car licenses at the same date one year ago. Fees collected totaled \$22,076,617.17, an increase of nearly two million dollars over last year's total at this date.

Dixon Marks Dedication of New Lincoln Statue

The city of Dixon has been planning to make an important event of the dedication of the statue of Lincoln about September 22 or 23 on the site of the fort in Dixon where Lincoln served in the army in the Black Hawk war in 1832. By joint resolution the last General Assembly provided for a Commission, which Governor Emmerson appointed to have charge of this memorial. About \$25,000 has been spent by the State on it.

Highwood Child Dies from Blood Poisoning

Martha Giarelli, the nine-year-old daughter of Faust Giarelli, a Highwood man, employed in Lake Forest, died Friday at the Alice Home hospital in Lake Forest, from a particularly virulent type of blood-poisoning. On Saturday, September 13, the little girl had been playing about on the street when a nail in her shoe made a small cut in her foot. No evidence remained of what might have caused the small wound. All that night she was unable to sleep with the pain in her foot, and on Sunday morning she was taken to the office of Dr. Theodore S. Proxmire of Lake Forest, who examined the child and took her to the Alice Home hospital. There the infection grew steadily worse throughout the week, and although every possible remedy was applied to save the life of the child, she died Friday afternoon.
