**Northwestern and Ohio  
to Use Same Type of  
Offense Next Saturday**

The same type of offense, the Warner system, will be used by Northwestern and Ohio when the two teams clash at Duche Stadium here next Saturday in the opening of the Big Ten season for the Wildcats. Ohio has already engaged in its initial conference game, having defeated Indiana last Saturday 23 to 0.

Coach Dick Hanley has been a disciple of the Warner system since his playing days, while Coach Sam Willaman installed the system at Ohio this year. Two distinctive features of the Warner system are the unbalanced line and the double wing backs.

The unbalanced line, sometimes known as the two-four line, places both tackles next to each other on the right side of the line. The only line-men to the left of the center are the left guard and the left end. On the right of the center are the right guard, right tackle, left tackle, and right end.

Both halfbacks play a yard in the rear and a yard outside of their respective ends, thus getting the name of wingbacks. Since the backs line up in this manner, it is necessary for the Warner system to make considerable use of the double and triple reverses in order to get the ball carriers out around the flanks.
