FROSH-SOPH TEAM
Loses to Oak Park

Oak Park's Freshman-Sophomore team proved too heavy for the Deerfield underclassmen and crashed through to a 12 to 0 victory over the locals in the curtain raiser last Saturday.

Greatly Outweighed

The Deerfield eleven fought hard but the superior weight of their opponents proved too severe a handicap to overcome. Neither team scored in the first quarter although the ball was in Oak Park territory most of the time. Late in the second quarter the Oak Parkers started a march which culminated when Richardson crossed the goal line on a drive through center.

Early in the third quarter a series of spinner and off tackle plays gave Oak Park the ball on the Floydmen's 8 yard line from where Lawrence scored on a quarter back sneak. The quarter ended with Deerfield trailing 12 to 0. A twenty yard run by "Jackie" Allens followed by Worthington's 40 yard sprint gave Deerfield a touchdown in the last quarter. The run was called back for off-sides and the game ended with the villagers triumphant, 12 to 0.

Saturday the locals engage the Proviso Frosh-Soph combination in Deerfield at 12:30. The Deerfield light weights will journey to Proviso.

The Redskins, members of the Navajo, Pueblo, Ottawa and Winnebago tribes, will provide a program of tribal songs and dances under the direction of Marx and Anne Oberndorfer. Mr. and Mrs. Oberndorfer, the former a past president of the Society of American Musicians, are known throughout the country for their research in the realm of native American music, their radio concerts, and their recitals.

In order that all the school children of Chicago and its suburbs may hear the programs, each of the five concerts is to be given at 9:30 a.m. and repeated at 11:15. The concerts will be given on alternate Saturday mornings, extending into mid-December, when the final program, "Christmas Carols of Many Lands," will be given in keeping with the holiday season.
