To a large group of enthusiastic parents, at the October meeting of the P. T. A. held in the school auditorium, Mrs. A. C. Stadler, school nurse discussed, "What the School Nurse Expects of the Mothers," while Dr. C. R. Sugden spoke on the subject of "Diphtheria."

Dr. Sugden, who has made careful study of diphtheria recommends the toxin-anti toxin, which will give positive protection against the disease and is a simple, harmless treatment given in three injections, one week apart. All children should secure this positive protection.
