New Transmission Line Chicago to Waukegan

Construction of a 30 mile transmission line which will connect the Waukegan generating plant of the Public Service company with the electrical distribution system of the Commonwealth Edison company in Chicago is near completion, it is reported.

The great transmission line will carry a voltage of 132,000 and consists of a series of giant steel towers which are strung with hundreds of miles of wire.

The new line will provide an additional outlet for the electricity generated by the new 65,000 kilowatt unit just completed by the Public Service company here at the cost of \$7,000,000.

The Waukegan plant is now connected with the Chicago system, with the Northwestern and south central part of Illinois, with northern Wisconsin and the east through various connections.

Resolution of Respect in Death of Atty. Hanna

As a mark of respect to L. P. Hanna, veteran member of the Lake County bar, who died suddenly recently while waiting for a train at the Chicago & North Western station Saturday morning, the Waukegan-North Chicago chamber of commerce passed a resolution of regret and condolence at a meeting last week. Mr. Hanna had been a member of the chamber of commerce for many years.

Operating Income of Northwestern Railroad Highest in September

The net operating expense of the Chicago & North Western railway for the month of September was the highest during the year of 1930, according to Fred W. Sargent, president of the organization.

September's net operating income for this year was approximately \$3,000,000, compared with the \$3,252,595 estimate of last September.

According to Mr. Sargent the outlook for October is more than usually optimistic, and officials expect a definite increase in the operating income. This is in contrast to the hard-times forecasts made by many for the late fall and winter months.

This announcement by a large metropolitan concern may be an indication that the present financial depression is already on the wane.
