as architect for a parish church in Cork, Ireland. His Immaculate high school on Irving Park boulevard, with the interesting sculptures by Alfonso Ianelli, is one of the thoroughly worthwhile architectural creations which we see as we drive to Chicago along Sheridan road and the Lake Shore drive.

Mr. George Wallace Carr is a member of the firm of Nimmons, Carr & Wright; interesting items from the work of this firm are several large country clubs in the Chicago district and numerous large branch stores built in various parts of the United States for Sears Roebuck & Co. Mr. Carr is one of the pioneer residents of Ravinia and is a member of the Highland Park school board.

Mr. William B. Mann is well known for his residential and commercial work. Among his recent commissions are the alterations now being made to the North Shore Trust Co. building in Highland Park, the new Schneider-Hundley building on Sheridan road, and the recently completed addition to the Moraine hotel. Mr. Mann is one of the old residents of Highland Park.

Mr. Frederick Hodgdon, of the firm of Stanton & Hodgdon, is the designer of our beautiful new city hall in Highland Park. He was also associate architect for the new Jewish synagogue on Sheridan road near Irving Park boulevard, in Chicago.

Mr. Frank Venning and Mr. Edward Merrill are members of the firm of Granger & Bollenbacher, whose outstanding achievements have been in the residential and ecclesiastical fields.

Mr. John Van Bergen has designed many charming residences in this district and has been one of the first to see and realize the beauties of Wisconsin ledge stone. He has also designed and built several schools, including the Braeside school and, in association with Mr. Lawrence Buck, the auditorium addition of the Ravinia school.

Mr. Harry H. Bentley has specialized in the field of domestic architecture. His residence for Mr. Henry Hammer, on Woodland road, Ravinia, was awarded the first prize of \$1000, for excellence of plan and design, in a competition held last year by the Chicago Builders' Exposition.

The work of Mr. Robert E. Seyfarth has been principally in the residential field and is distinguished for its impeccable taste in proportion and beauty of detail.

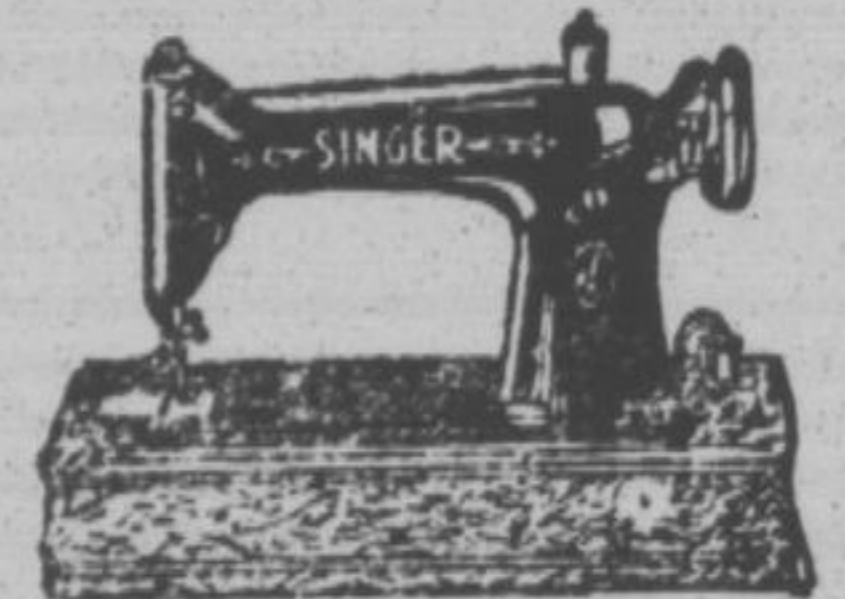

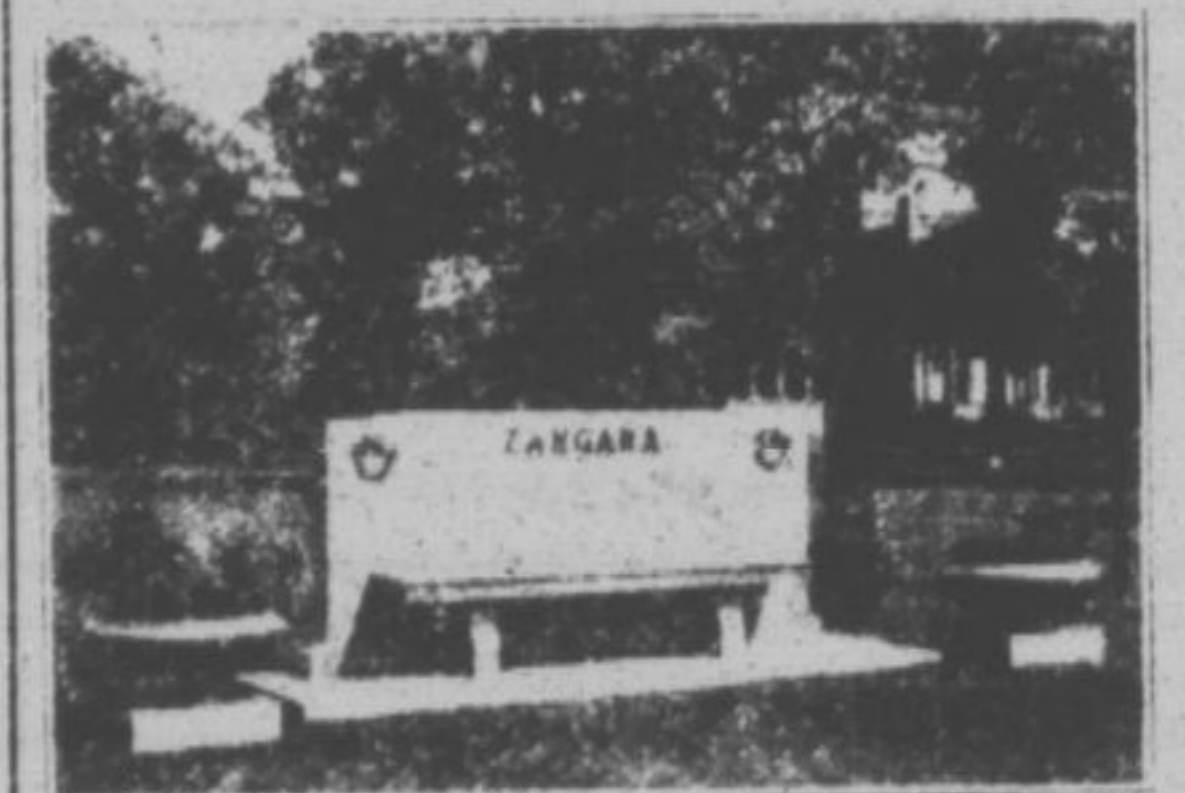
