

Tiffany Picked by Tribune to Win in Race for Sheriff

In a column story in last Sunday's Tribune the political situation approaching the election of Nov. 4 is analyzed as regards the principal candidates and their prospects. With regard to the candidacy of Chief Lester T. Tiffany of Lake Forest, for sheriff on the Republican ticket, the story says:

"The fight for the sheriff's office has attracted major interest as a sequel to a mud-slinging campaign against Tiffany. Mr. Tiffany, as chief of police of Lake Forest, made an enviable record for efficiency and established himself in popularity through the north shore district. His

backers have been aroused by what they described as a mud-slinging campaign against him, and predict that he will be elected by an overwhelming majority. He was nominated in the primary by one of the largest majorities ever given a candidate in Lake county.

Deny Bolt from Tiffany

"In the primary contest four candidates opposed Tiffany for the nomination and a spirited campaign was the result. Opponents of Chief Tiffany during the fall campaign have circulated propaganda that some of the Republicans he defeated in the primary race were now supporting the Democratic nominee, but the Republican county central committee last week issued a statement saying all the losing candidates had joined the forces for Chief Tiffany and declared the party was united in sup-

port of Chief Tiffany's candidacy.

Backed by Committee

"In a signed statement the county committee said the Republican organization was "proud to have such an outstanding man as Mr. Tiffany, widely known for his fearlessness in police work and his ability to cope with crime, as its candidate for the important office of sheriff.

"The committee expressed the opinion that Lake county was highly fortunate to have Chief Tiffany as the nominee sheriff, especially at this time when gangsters and hoodlums were threatening more than ever to locate in counties adjoining Cook county. Chief Tiffany, the committee said, as sheriff would prevent any invasion of Lake county by the hoodlums and racketeers."

Waukegan Paper Boosts Him

The Waukegan News-Sun on Monday printed a two-column cut of Tiffany on the front page under the heading, "Believes in Lake County," and beneath the picture a lengthy story reciting the candidate's excellent qualifications and fine record as a citizen and office holder.
