In order that patrons may be fully advised concerning the dates on which articles should be mailed to assure delivery in the country of destination on or before Christmas day, there is furnished herewith a list showing approximately the latest dates articles should be posted for each country concerned.

Due to the customs, formalities which must, in most cases, be complied with in connection with parcel post packages, it is difficult to state definitely the exact time to assure delivery to addressee and such articles should be mailed in advance of the date given whenever possible so as to connect with earlier steamers and avoid delay due to congestion in foreign post offices:
