

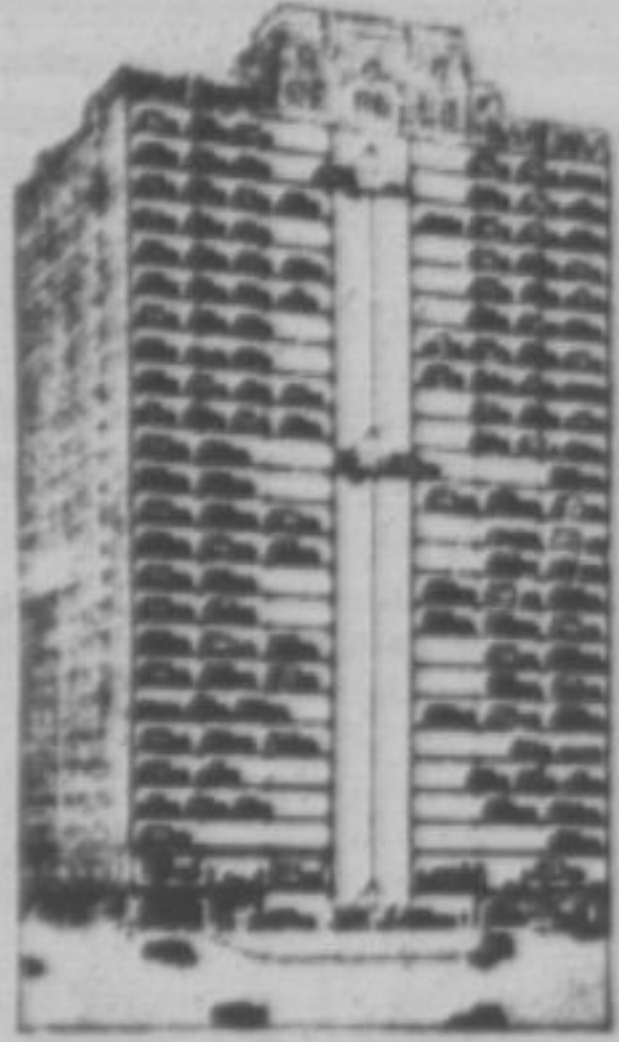

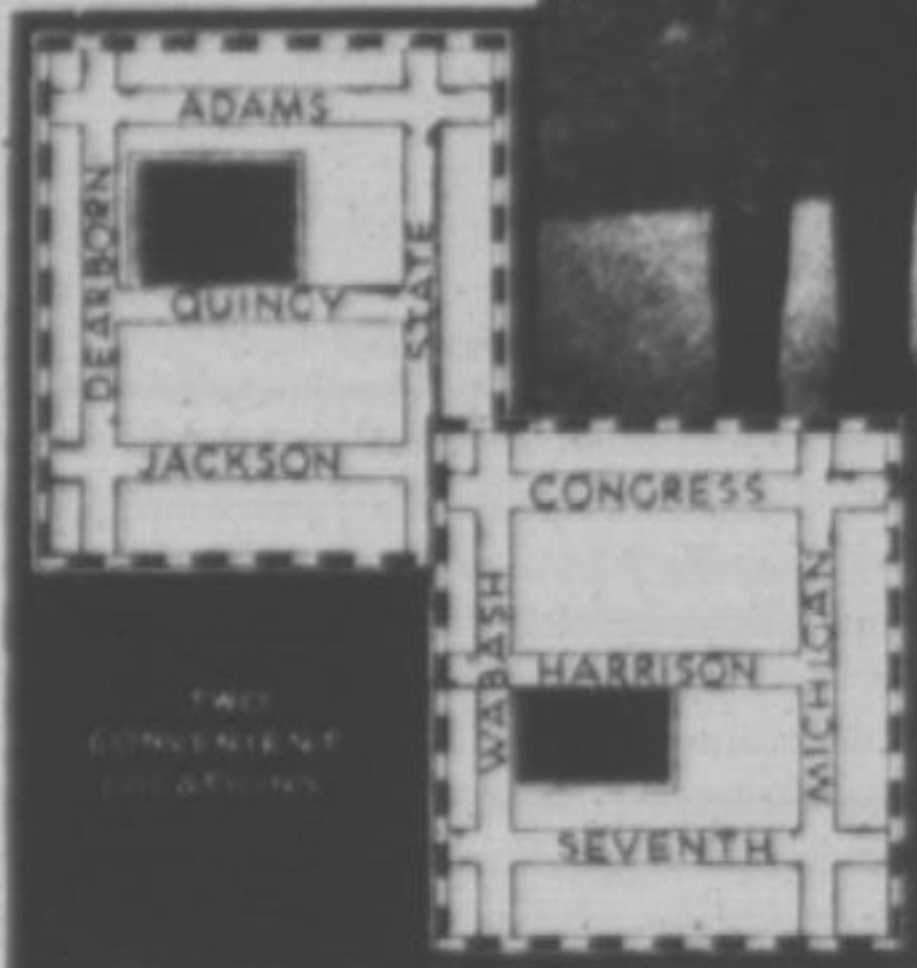

## BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

### Interesting Happenings About This Part of North Shore; County Seat

Waukegan has been suggested as a possible site for the location of a new federal prison hospital to be constructed for the Department of Justice in the middle west.

Five hunters, caught in a bad storm on Fox Lake nearly lost their lives when their boats were swamped and before the exhausted men could be pulled to shore there were nine struggling in the icy waters.

Formation of a vigilance committee which will consist of merchants and professional men and all others interested in the welfare of the community is being considered as a measure of combatting an expected wave of crime in Waukegan this year.

A shelter, or free lodging house, with a free soup kitchen in connection, is to be established in Waukegan, according to announcement made by Captain P. H. Robb, in charge of the Salvation Army there.

Waukegan was selected as the convention city of the Illinois Municipal league at the closing session of this year's convention at Springfield.

John Riebock, 78 years old, who has resided in Lake county for almost sixty years, passed away at his home at 24 South Elmwood avenue, Waukegan, last week.

Howard Amet, inventor of the first motion picture film ever shown and a former resident of Waukegan, plans to return there for a short stay from his home in California. Mr. Amet with George K. Spoor, also of Waukegan, produced the first motion pictures here on the flats north of the city in 1895.

Frank Suhadolnik, Jr., 28, a deputy attached to Sheriff L. A. Doolittle's motorcycle squad during the past two years, was found dead in bed last week from asphyxiation.

Mrs. Johanna Grace, 91, one of Lake county's best known pioneers, died at her Wauconda home last week. Four weeks ago, Mrs. Grace stumbled over a rug in her home, breaking her hip in the fall. Death was due to the injuries received.

### Lake Co. Prisoners at Pontiac Seek Paroles

Raymond Hitchcock, 19-year-old Lake Bluff bandit who is serving a sentence of one to ten years for larceny in the penitentiary at Pontiac; Leslie Kilbane, 26, of Waukegan, serving a long sentence for robbery; Kendrick McCall, 21, of North Chicago, serving a one to ten year term at the penitentiary, and Marvin Vreeland, 23, of Fort Sheridan and who has served one year of his one to ten year term at the penitentiary for stealing cigarettes, are to be up for parole hearings on November 5, State's Attorney A. V. Smith was notified.

### Police Co-Operation Along Entire Lake Is Plan to Be Discussed

Plans to combat crime on a large battle front ranging from Michigan City, Ind., to Racine, Wis., by coordinating all law enforcing agencies under a unified control will be discussed at a conference to be held at the University of Chicago, Nov. 20.

The plan, if carried out, will provide a metropolitan police force for the entire front of 125 miles which would include Waukegan and Lake county.

The plan has the sanction of President Robert Maynard Hutchins, to whom it has been outlined in a series of discussions with August Volkmmer, professor of police administration at the University of Chicago. Frank J. Loesch, president of the Chicago Crime Commission, has been active in furthering the works.

There have been 350 invitations issued for the conference including Commissioner Wilson L. Gee and Assistant Chief of Police Thomas E. Kennedy.

Among the innovations proposed are squad cars to range through the area, which would be equipped with submachine guns and radio receiving sets, a centralized broadcasting system and a complete teletype system.

### Forty and Eight Hold Party at Bonnie Brook

Forty and eight held an elaborate dinner, entertainment and dance on Wednesday evening, Oct. 29, at 7 o'clock, at the Bonnie Brook Golf club. Arrangements were made to take care of one hundred couples. The organization's own orchestra furnished music for dancing.
