County Central Chairman Returns from Springfield Optimistic

Attorney Max Przyborski, chairman of the Republican County Ceninto the matter and to report as to tral committee returning last week from Sprinfield where he attended the session of the Illinois Commerce Commission, stated that Mrs. Ruth Hanna McCormick will win the senatorial race against J. Hamilton Lewis, the Democratic candidate, by at least 50,-000 votes.

> He said that he based his prediction on the general concensus of political leaders of the major parties with whom he spoke. In Lake county, Mr. Przyborski prophesied, the electorate would give Mrs. McCormick a majority of at least 10,000.

"The vote in Lake county will run about the same as it did in the presiciential election in 1928," Mr. Przyborski told Waukegan papers. "Most of the voters who cast their ballots for Smith in 1928 will probably vote for Lewis. That group of electors will band together in Lake county for the Democratic candidate."

Mr. Przyborski indicated that while the vote in Lake county may not approach the proportions it did at the presidential election, he believed that more than 30,000 of the 40,000 voters in the county would cast ballots.

Only routine matters were discussed by the commerce commission, Mr. Przyborski said, none of them relating directly to Lake county.

Low Employment Figures Shown in State in Sept.

Indications of greater activity in a number of Illinois cities were registered despite the general decline in employment during the period from August 5 to September 15, the State Department of Labor reported.

Some of this activity, the report stated, was of a seasonal character as at canning factories.

The Illinois all-industry employment index registered 85.4 in September, the report states, which is a Grop of 1.1 per cent from the preceding month and a loss of 17.3 per cent since a year ago. This is the lowest employment figure on record, the report states.


All Illinois industries paid an average weekly wage of \$30.04 to men and \$18.54 to women.


