

May Carry Township Problem to Supreme Court, Expectation

That section of Benton township which was left by an act of the Board of Supervisors at the September session which took Zion out and established a new township of that city strengthened by the support of the Independents of Zion, will carry the fight to dissolve the action of the Board of Supervisors to the supreme court, it was indicated last week.

At an enthusiastic rally held at the community hall in Winthrop Harbor Judge Charles Miller, for Mayor J. P. Winthrop Harbor, and Thomas H. Nelson touched on each of the possible angles which contributed to bringing the petition from the Zion city council to the Board of Supervisors. Some of the movements leading up to the act were denounced as unconstitutional.

Residents from Beach, Zion and Winthrop Harbor, attending the meeting, voiced their approval of bringing the case before the supreme court

if there is any possible illegal action on the part of the Zion council or the Board of Supervisors in divorcing Zion from the rest of Benton township.

The committee of nine, three representing each of Beach, Winthrop Harbor and Zion Independents, was urged to continue its investigation into the matter and to report as to what action should be taken at a mass meeting to be held at Zion on Monday, Nov. 3.

SAYS REPUBLICANS WILL SWEEP STATE

County Central Chairman Returns from Springfield Optimistic

Attorney Max Przyborski, chairman of the Republican County Central committee returning last week from Springfield where he attended the session of the Illinois Commerce Commission, stated that Mrs. Ruth Hanna McCormick will win the senatorial race against J. Hamilton Lewis, the Democratic candidate, by at least 50,000 votes.

He said that he based his prediction on the general consensus of political leaders of the major parties with whom he spoke. In Lake county, Mr. Przyborski prophesied, the electorate would give Mrs. McCormick a majority of at least 10,000.

"The vote in Lake county will run about the same as it did in the presidential election in 1928," Mr. Przyborski told Waukegan papers. "Most of the voters who cast their ballots for Smith in 1928 will probably vote for Lewis. That group of electors will band together in Lake county for the Democratic candidate."

Mr. Przyborski indicated that while the vote in Lake county may not approach the proportions it did at the presidential election, he believed that more than 30,000 of the 40,000 voters in the county would cast ballots.

Only routine matters were discussed by the commerce commission, Mr. Przyborski said, none of them relating directly to Lake county.

Low Employment Figures Shown in State in Sept.

Indications of greater activity in a number of Illinois cities were registered despite the general decline in employment during the period from August 5 to September 15, the State Department of Labor reported.

Some of this activity, the report stated, was of a seasonal character as at canning factories.

The Illinois all-industry employment index registered 85.4 in September, the report states, which is a drop of 1.1 per cent from the preceding month and a loss of 17.3 per cent since a year ago. This is the lowest employment figure on record, the report states.

All Illinois industries paid an average weekly wage of \$30.04 to men and \$18.54 to women.

Bank Robber Placed on Probation; Says He Stole for Family

Pleading guilty on the charge that he attempted to rob the Lake County State bank at North Chicago, Bruce Morse was placed on probation by Judge Edward D. Shurtleff last week on the recommendation of the Rev. Gilbert Stansell.

Morse confessed that he attempted the robbery to buy food for his wife and family after all attempts to secure work failed.

Statements as to his character and past reputation were presented the court from Lake county citizens and from his former home community in Pennsylvania.

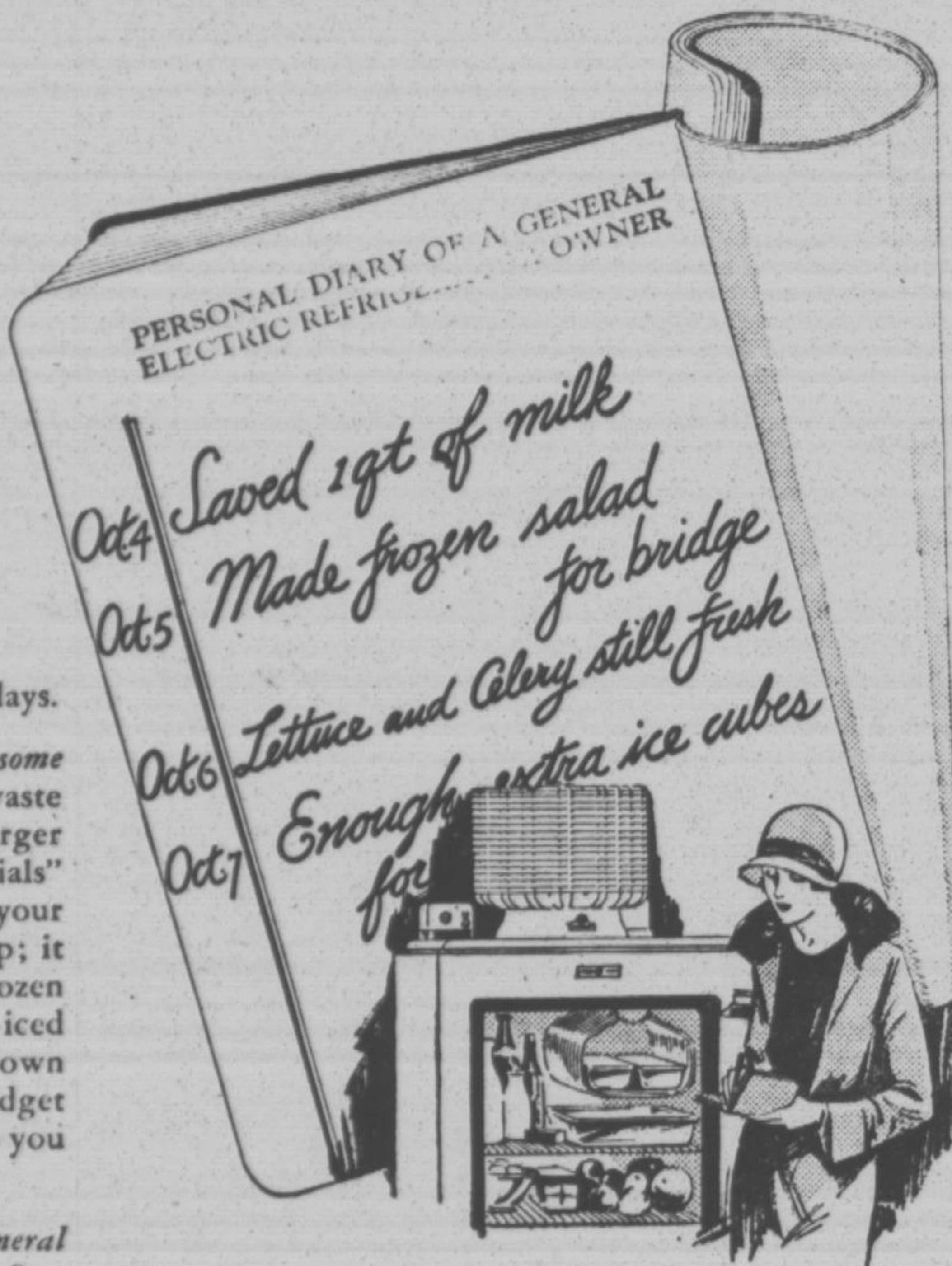
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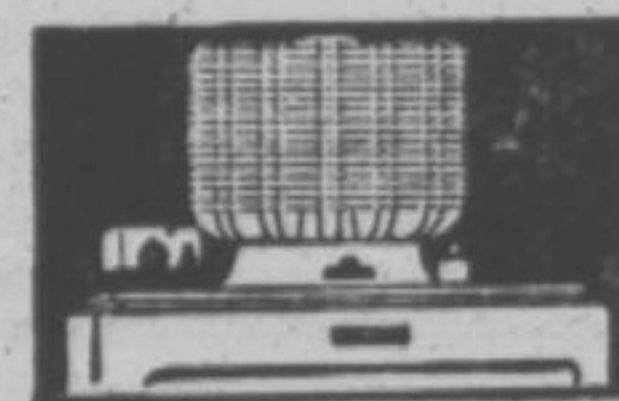
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
