The Juvenile Delinquency department of the social bureau in one of our large western cities has issued the following statement: "The factors in juvenile delinquency are: Lack of parental watchfulness; Lack of parental instruction; Lack of parental association.

Ninety per cent of the juvenile court cases are the result of parental neglect. "These words which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart; and thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children," is God's command to parents. See Deut. 6:6-9.
