Jesus did not excuse or condone the sins of the prodigal but his judgement of the sins of this older brother with his self-righteousness, pride, selfishness and lack of love was as scorching as they deserved. When the story closed, the prodigal was within where all was light and warmth and love and it was the older brother who remained without. No one shut him out. He just shut himself out."
