

Illinois League of Women Voters. Enthusiastic reports of the service rendered by women jurors is being re-

The governor of Pennsylvania, John S. Fisher, writes, "Since the enfranchisement of women, we have qualified them for jury service. The matter of having women on juries is new accepted as a matter of course. Personally I feel that jury service is a part of every citizen's duty, and I ee no reason for discriminating against women voters."

Further Testimony

Governor Theodore Christianson of Minnesota writes, "Women are serving on juries in Minnesota and have been for several years and the processes of justice have certainly not suffered as a result. I believe that women on the whole are more concientious jurors than men and more attentive to the testimony of witnesses. They are probably lacking in some cases in that background of experience with affairs which furnish the basis of litigation but I feel that this lack is in a large degree compensated for by woman's instinctive disposition to be right and do right."

"I believe that women should be permitted to serve on juries," says Covernor George H. Dern of Utah. "It has been our experience in the state of Utah that women jurors ex-Libit excellent judgment in deciding the merits of a case. Their interests in the welfare of society are natural-

Governor Meyer Y. Cooper of Ohio, John Hammill of Iowa and G. F. Shafer of North Dakota find that women have given very satisfactory service in their states.

The referendum in Illinois on womon on juries comes on November 4th. Govern r Louis L. Emmerson has declared himself in favor of the measure as have the Republican and Demscratic parties.
