Chief Chibiaboos Gives Inter- esting Program Tuesday; Mrs. Brazelton

Chief Chibiaboos, a Chippewa Indian, entertained a very appreciative audience on Tuesday afternoon, Nov. 4, at the Highland Park Woman's club. His mission, he said, was to give a picture of the "Indian of Yesterday and the Indian of Today."

He gave a short sketch of his life as a student. He attended both the Haskell institute and the University of Minnesota. He endured many hardships in order to gain his education and appealed to his listeners to give any deserving Indian a chance.
