The convention will open with registration at 10 a.m. on Nov. 11 to be followed by an executive board meeting at 10:15. At 11:15 A.M. Mrs. Abraham Veil of Chicago, honorary president of the State Federation, will formally open the session with the invocation to be followed by an address of welcome by Mrs. Harry L. Canmann of Highland Park, convention chairman. The response from the convention to this welcome will be given by Mrs. Joseph Hamerslough of Springfield, Illinois, second vice-president of the State Federation.

The luncheon at 12:30 will be followed by various reports of secretaries and committee chairmen. The speakers of the afternoon will be Mrs. G. George Fox of Chicago, state president of the federation, who, as president will deliver her message; and Mrs. Maurice Steinfeld of St. Louis, national president of the Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, who

will speak on "Aims, obligations, and opportunities of the sisterhood." Discussion and adjournment are scheduled for 5 p.m.
