The house is located on a corner lot of 75x100 feet and is of the English cottage style.

There are three bed rooms and a bath upstairs, and a living room, dining room, kitchen, and butler's pantry downstairs. The interesting part about the butler's pantry is that it has closets inside for mops, vacuum cleaners, and necessary household utensils. It is conveniently placed between the living room and dining room.

The living room has a southern exposure, with their sides exposed to sun light.

The porch may be entered from both the living room and kitchen, thus enabling it to be used for a breakfast room.

Either the garage, yard, or basement may be entered from the back porch by the same way.
