

**Perfect Bone Needle  
Field Museum, Chicago  
Is 25,000 Years Old**

A perfect bone needle, some 25,000 years old, has come to Field Museum of Natural History as a result of the recent Marshall Field Archaeological Expedition to Europe. This bone needle, which is more than three inches in length, is complete and has as perfect an eye as if it had been made yesterday. It was made by a prehistoric Magdalenian craftsman, according to Henry Field, assistant curator of physical anthropology and leader of the expedition, and it was undoubtedly used for making clothes out of reindeer skins.

The needle was excavated from an ancient rock shelter at Ganties in the south of France, where it was found among implements of flint and bone typical of the upper Magdalenian culture. The needle was evidently fashioned with a flint blade and drilled by a flint borer.

**MRS. CARRIE C. CATT  
WINS MAGAZINE PRIZE**

**Leader in Suffrage and Peace  
Work Gets \$5,000 Award  
for Efforts**

Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, leader in suffrage and peace work, was chosen the 1930 winner of the \$5,000 award given annually by a nationally known magazine for the American woman who has contributed most to the national life in letters, art, science, philanthropy or social welfare.

In making the award the judges were moved by Mrs. Catt's recent efforts in the interests of international peace, and her activities in securing for women a greater share in public life, following her long period of leadership in the woman's suffrage movement.

The judge's committee included Bruce Barton, author; Senator Arthur Capper, Kansas; Mme. Louise Homer, singer; Clark Howell, editor; Otto H. Kahn; Dr. Henry Goddard Leach, editor; Edwin Markham, poet; Mrs. Henry Peabody, president of the women's board of foreign missions; Mrs. Stanley Resor; Carl Sandburg, poet; Mrs. John F. Sippel, president of the General Federation of Women's clubs; Mis Ida Tarbell, writer; Augustus O. Thomas, department of education, Augusta, Me., and Miss Mary Woolley, president of Mt. Holyoke college.

**Now 72 Years Old**

Mrs. Catt is in her 72nd year. As a worker and speaker she worked indefatigably in the cause of suffrage, organizing innumerable clubs, a speakers' school and the Woman's Suffrage party. She emphasized educational methods and opposed picketing, heckling, hunger strikes and other tactics of the militants.

As the suffrage movement grew Mrs. Catt gradually extended the work into other countries. She organized the International Woman Suffrage Alliance, of which she became president in 1904. She resigned in 1923 and was made honorary president.

On Oct. 8, 1918, just 23 years after Mrs. Catt made her first speech for woman's suffrage, she cast her first vote.

Mrs. Catt's work for peace began during the World war. She worked constantly to bring the conflict to an end, and after the conflict she called a meeting in Washington, D. C., of a number of national women's organizations, which resulted in the founding of the National Committee on the Cause and Cure of War, of which she was made chairman. She believes that the present century will mark the end of war for all time.

A staunch defender of the Eighteenth amendment, Mrs. Catt has waged war on vice in speeches and magazine articles.
