Destroyed by Fire Early Sunday Night

Destruction by fire of the Central hotel building, at Genesee and Water street, Waukegan, housing five business concerns, at a total loss estimated as being near \$100,000, menaced the central business section of the city for hours, Sunday evening.

The fire, one of the most spectacular in the history of the city, attracted thousands of spectators, who stood for hours in the misting rain to watch several fire companies in their desperate fight to keep the flames from spreading to adjacent buildings. 
