Waukegan Landmark Destroyed by Fire Early Sunday Night

Destruction by fire of the Central hotel building, at Genesee and Water street, Waukegan, housing five business concerns, at a total loss estimated as being near \$100,000, menaced the central business section of the city for hours, Sunday evening.

The fire, one of the most spectacular in the history of the city, attracted thousands of spectators, who stood for hours in the misting rain to watch several fire companies in their desperate fight to keep the flames from spreading to adjacent buildings. The Lake Forest fire apparatus was not at the fire.

Parts of Walls Standing

Only the front wall and a portion of the rear wall of the building, owned by J. Blumberg, which has stood on that corner for nearly 40 years were standing Monday morning, as mute evidence of the ravaging flames that swept through the big structure. These walls were torn down as a measure of safety. Blumberg plans immediate erection of a modern structure on the site, it is reported.

Five business concerns were wiped out in the conflagration. They were: North Shore Fruit market and grocery, owned by Frank Kimmell, 102 S. Genesee street; Hollywood restaurant, Christ Katopodis, proprietor, at 104 S. Genesee; Joseph Joslun Tailor shop at 106 S. Genesee; Coney Island restaurant, owned by Nick Drecos, at 205 Water street, and the hotel company on the second and third floors of the building owned, by Nick Drecos and John Harris. Only two of the business concerns had insurance.
