

**Believed Five-Day Week  
May Be Adopted Soon  
by Lake County Labor**

The five day a week plan, not only for union labor but for industrial employes as well is not far removed according to Waukegan labor leaders who are confident that the various chapters in the Lake County Building Trades council will sanction the short week plan, says a Waukegan newspaper.

The Associated Builders of Lake county suggested the short week, which clips a half day off the payroll of each man, with the object in view of giving more men employment.

Several trades union units will go on the five-day week plan this week. The carpenters and plasterers are included in this list.

Skilled labor is of the opinion that the short week, first espoused by Henry Ford, will be nation wide in effect before the close of another year and that the movement will spread to the factories.

**Two Youthful Bandits  
Get Sentences of One  
to Ten Years in Pen**

Two youthful bandits, who confessed to taking part in several 'stick-ups' on parked motorists through the county to State Policeman Harry Quandt, a former deputy sheriff, last Thursday pleaded guilty before Circuit Judge Edward Shurtleff and received an indeterminate term of one to ten years in Joliet penitentiary.

Those who confessed guilt and were sentenced were William J. Wassong, of Chicago, and Charles Meyers, of Waukegan.

William May, pointed out as one of the quintet went to trial before a jury after entering a plea of not guilty. He was represented by Attorney Harry Breger while States Attorney A. V. Smith and Assistant States Attorney S. H. Block were prosecuting.

This left two more men to try. They are Edward Janiszewski, of North Chicago, and Walter Holub alias Wasily Subotke, of Chicago, who was wounded by Quandt when caught on the night of Sept. 7. Deputy Sheriff Henry Anderson was with Quandt.

Holub was not brought to trial due to his injuries and Janiszewski was not named in the indictment being heard now.

**Three Damage Suits  
in Circuit Court  
Ask \$60,000 Total**

Three personal injury suits, asking a total in damages of \$60,000, today were filed in circuit court.

In two of these a husband and ex-wife, Arthur A. Beckman and Tillie Beckman, both of Chicago, were plaintiffs seeking \$25,000 each. They were struck, according to Attorney E. M. Runyard, of Runyard & Behanna, by a Parks & Nielson Radio company truck of Fox Lake, Dwight C. Parks, Sayde Parke, and Evelyn Nielsen were named as defendants.

The accident happened May 3. Beckman had several teeth knocked out, his jaw broken, spine dislocated and ribs fractured. Mrs. Beckman, who was unconscious for three days, had 19 broken ribs.
