But the main problem is not with the boys and girls; it is with their parents; they do not see things in the right light. The writer heard about certain parents, well known to him, who are heart-broken today because their son is going wrong. They were blind to the situation when he entered upon the wrong path. Now it is quite difficult to correct him.
