NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held in the Council Chamber in the City Hall in the City of Highland Park, Illinois, on Tuesday, the 2nd day of December, 1930, at eight o'clock P. M. which said public hearing will be conducted by the undersigned, the Zoning Committee for the City of Highland Park, designated and appointed by the Council of the City of Highland Park for that purpose to consider amending an ordinance entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE amending an Ordinance entitled 'An Ordinance to regulate and limit the height and bulk of buildings; to regulate and limit the intensity of the use of lot areas, and to regulate and determine the areas of open spaces within and surrounding such buildings; to classify, regulate, and restrict the location of trades and industries and the location of buildings designed for specified industrial, business, residential, and other uses; to divide the entire City of Highland Park into districts for the purpose of this ordinance; to fix standards to which buildings or structures shall conform; to prohibit uses, buildings, or structures incompatible with the character of such districts respectively; and to prevent additions to and alterations or remodeling of existing buildings or structures in such a way as to avoid the restrictions and limitations lawfully imposed hereunder, and to provide penalties

for violation hereof,' as amended' in the following manner:

It is proposed that the following paragraph be added to Article IV, Section I of the above Zoning Ordinance of the City of Highland Park:

"9- Clubs not conducted as a business or for profit, and situated on premises not less than twenty (20) acres in area."

It is proposed that the following changes be made in the above Zoning Ordinance of the City of Highland Park:

(1) Article VI, Section I, sub-paragraph 47, to be amended to read as follows: "The use of premises or buildings as Dancing Academies, Filling Stations, Lodge Halls, Public Garages and Theaters, shall be subject to the regulations of the present or hereafter adopted laws and ordinances of the City of Highland Park; provided that no person, firm or corporation shall locate, build, construct or maintain premises or buildings for the purposes of Dancing Academies, Lodge Halls, Public Garages or Theaters within two hundred (200) feet of any building used as and for a Hospital, Church, Library, Public or Private School, or within two hundred (200) feet of the district boundary line of an "A" or "B" district. The two hundred (200) feet mentioned above shall in both cases be measured along the street line of the street or streets on which the premises abut."

(2) "All property lying between the easterly line of the right-of-way of the Chicago, North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad, and the westerly boundary of the right-of-way for the new State Highway No. 57, and between the south boundary of the City and the north line of Section 34, Township 43, Range 12, shall be zoned for commercial use, except the following described property, which shall be zoned for business use:

"(a) That part of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the Third Principal Meridian, described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point in the center line of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12, where said center line intersects with the easterly right-of-way line of the Chicago North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad; thence north along said easterly line of said Chicago North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad 183 feet; thence east on a line parallel to the center line of said Section 35, to the point of intersection of the said parallel line with the westerly line of the proposed right-of-way State Route 57; thence southeasterly along said westerly line of said proposed Route 57 183 feet to the center line of said Section 35; thence west along the center line of said Section 35, being the center line of Clavey Road to the place of beginning, being the intersection of said center line with the easterly line of the Chicago, North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad right-of-way, all situated in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois.

"(b) That part of the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of the Third Principal Meridian, described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point on the center line of said Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12, East of the Third Principal Meridian, where said center line intersects with the westerly line of the right-of-way of proposed State Route 57; thence southeasterly along said right-of-way 183 feet; thence west along a line parallel to the said center line of said Section 35 to the point where said parallel line intersects the east line of the Chicago, North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad right-of-way; thence north along the east line of said Chicago, North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad right-of-way to a point where said east line of said Chicago, North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad right-of-way intersects with the center line of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12 East; thence east along said center line to the place of beginning, being the intersection of said center line with the westerly line of the right-of-way of proposed State Route 57.

"(c) That part of the East One-Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 12, East of the Third Principal Meridian, comprising part of Lot Two and part of Lot Three and part of Lot Four in the Subdivision of the West 22½ Acres of the South 30 Acres of the East One-half of said Southwest Quarter, described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the intersection of the division County Line between Lake County and Cook County with the East Line of the Chicago, North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad right-of-way, thence Northwesterly along the said East Line of said right-of-way 200 feet, thence East on a line parallel to the said division line between Lake County and Cook County to the point of intersection of said parallel line with the westerly boundary line of the proposed right-of-way for State Route 57; thence Southeasterly along said West line of said right-of-way as proposed, 200 feet to the center line of County Line Road, being the division line between Lake County and Cook County, thence West along said County Line to the place of beginning, being the intersection of said County Line with the East Line of the Chicago, North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad right-of-way, all situated in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois."

At said public hearing an opportunity will be afforded to all persons interested in the changes above mentioned to be heard in relation to said proposed amendments.
