Wisconsin Woman Dies in H. P. Hospital from Injuries in Auto Crash

Mrs. Jennie Wiersma, 27, of Cambria, Wisconsin, died early Saturday morning at the Highland Park hospital of a broken neck and other injuries received Thursday afternoon when an automobile skidded on slippery pavement on Waukegan road, near Deerfield, and crashed into a tree.

Although paralyzed, Mrs. Wiersma was conscious to the end, hospital officials said. Mrs. Wiersma died at 1 o'clock Saturday morning.

Four other persons, Mr. and Mrs. John Wiersma, and Mr. and Mrs. Lambert Dykman were injured in the accident, which occurred on Green Bay road near Deerfield. The two men were discharged Thursday night after treatment, but the two women are still under treatment in the hospital. Mrs. John Wiersma's injuries are believed to be serious.
