 An Important Decision

After mature deliberation our congregation at a regular meeting arrived at the unanimous decision, to discontinue preaching in the German language.

When this congregation was organized over 40 years ago, the services were conducted exclusively in the German language, because its members had received its religious instruction in that language and because German was still spoken in the home. But time brought about a natural change, and 20 years ago the congregation became bi-lingual; because the children were being instructed in English. For the last years the German services were being attended only by the older members; and since in the last months so few of these were able to attend regularly, it became discouraging to them and to the pastor.

Therefore there will be but one service on Sunday mornings, at 10:30 in the language of our country. Occasionally, on high festivals and on communion Sundays we shall announce a service in the German language for the benefit of our older members.

On Thanksgiving day we shall meet at our house of worship at 10:30 a.m., to render our due gratitude to the Giver of all good gifts. Let the Lord not have cause to say of our members: "Where are the nine?" The thank-offering on that day will be devoted to the spreading of the Kingdom of Christ, more particularly to the reduction of our synodical debt.

Our church school meets not only on Sunday mornings at 9:30, but also on Saturday mornings at 9. Parents, give your children this extra hour of instruction.
