## New County Officers Assume Duties Next Monday; Are Certified

Governor Louis L. Emmerson on Tuesday certified Lake county officers who will take their positions Monday and at the same time bonds were filed with County Clerk Lew A. Hendee.

Among the officials certified were Sheriff Lester T. Tiffany, Probate Judge Martin C. Decker, County Judge P. L. Persons, County Clerk Hendee, County Treasurer Jay B. Morse and County Superintendent of Schools W. C. Petty. Mr. Petty will take office in August when the school year is closed.

Sheriff Lawrence Doolittle believes that he will have about 40 prisoners to turn over to Tiffany. Of this number 10 will be federal convicts. The flow of federal prisoners, was shut off six months ago when the jail became overcrowded.

Doolittle plans to leave on a short hunting trip as soon as he retires from office and then will live in his cabin in Wisconsin until the middle of winter when he will go to Florida.

## 220 ATTEND CHARTER NIGHT DINNER NOV. 20

### Fine Program Given at Rotary Club Meeting. Many Visitors Present

Thursday evening, Nov. 20, a splendid dinner and entertainment was tendered the sixteen charter members of the newly organized Rotary club of Deerfield, by their hosts and sponsors, the Highland Park Rotary club. Rotary guest delegations were present from Evanston, Wilmette, Winnetka, Glencoe, Highland Park, North Chicago, Waukegan, Cicero, Oak Park, DeKalb, Streator, Aurora, Chicago Heights, and Maywood, including a number of members from Chicago Club No. 1.

The auditorium of the Deerfield Grammar school was filled to capacity, where covers had been laid for two hundred and fifty guests. An excellent duck dinner was served under the direction of Clayton Fehr and officials of the Deerfield club.

The toastmaster of the evening was Sol St. Peter of the Highland Park Rotary club who surprised the guest aggregation with an entertainment that will long be happily remembered.

Various presidents of the visiting Rotary organizations extended two minute greetings to the new Deerfield club, after which officers and directors of Rotary International were introduced, each offering in their turn, brief discussions on the endeavors and accomplishments of Rotary in its local and international aims.

Judge Smith P. Free of New Zealand, and a director of Rotary International, was the honored guest of the evening and impressed his listeners with interesting topics of exceptional Rotarian interest. This gentleman is seventy years of age, and a director of Rotary from the farthest corner of the earth.

The principal speaker of the evening was Rev. Allen A. Stockdale, chairman of the educational committee of Rotary International. His address was dynamic, eloquent, and it was the consensus of opinion among those who lingered, that few gentlemen have ever inspired an audience as did Rev. Stockdale in his discussion of the aims and objects in Rotary, and the fellowship it sponsors. Rev. Stockdale told of his interview recently, while in Europe, with Anton Lang, the Christus of the Passion Play. He charged the new Deerfield Rotary organization with being true exponents of Rotary, and all that its name and meaning imply.

A presentation was made the Deerfield club of a huge silken American Flag and emblemized banner, by the combined Glencoe, Winnetka and Wilmette Rotary clubs. The Highland Park club presented them with a bronzed and ebony gong and gavel.

The Rotary charter was presented to Deerfield by Norme Fultz, Governor of the 40th District, and a grateful speech of acceptance by Pres. Jack O'Connell, acknowledged the honors which have been given the new local club.
