Miss Lustgarten, the young, refreshingly simple pianiste, conjures up thoughts of a future luminary in the musical firmament. Her program gave evidence of marked versatility. She moved easily from the classical school into the modern. Her interpretation of the Brahms E minor intermezzo was such as to satisfy the most critical students of that master Compositions in minor keys generally create an atmosphere of melancholy. Brahms, and his present interpreter proved the contrary. Her shadings blend imperceptably, and create an infinitely beautiful effect. Strawinsky, Ganz and Liszt followed. One tiny bit,-of but a moment's duration, "The Wind" caused a pleasurable ripple through the audience. Miss Litzgarten prefaced her selections with a few interesting comments, in a manner delightfully naive.
